Senior Lunch is back in 2023. Join resident seniors for lunch at Village Hall on the 2nd Tuesday of each month. Registration is required in advance. The cost is \$5.

Village offices will close for Presidents' Day on February 20, 2023. The holiday will not affect waste or recycling collection.

The Montgomery Property Tax Rebate Program application period is open for the tax year 2021 through February 28, 2023. Apply online at montgomeryil.org.

Please be advised that once two inches (2") of snow has accumulated, the Village's parking ban goes into effect. Residents must move all cars from the street to allow our crews to properly clear the roadways for the safety of residents and visitors.

As residents prepare for spring construction projects, please remember that permits are required for all exterior projects, including fence installation. A copy of our Unified Development Ordinance is available on our website, providing additional guidelines for building within the Village limits.

Senior Services

Discounted Garbage Rates: Residents of Montgomery over 65 may be eligible for a 10% discount on their monthly garbage service fee. If you'd like to find out more or apply, you can visit Village Hall Monday through Friday between 8A-4:30P or call 630-896-1357. Limited spaces are available for this program through the Village refuse hauler, LRS Recycling.

Home Flooding Assistance

As a free public service, the Certified Floodplain Manager for the Village can provide residents with assistance related to flood risk management and drainage concerns. In addition, staff can arrange on-site visits for property owners, contractors, and real estate agents interested in specific advances about measures to reduce flood risk.

The Village can also provide information about financial assistance available to property owners who want to secure their dwelling structures against flood damage better. If you want more information, contact the Community Development Department at 331-212-9022.

SPRING HYDRANT FLUSHING

Hydrant flushing will occur in the Village and unincorporated areas during the weeks of March 20, 27, and April 3 from 7A-6P. The purpose is to clear sediment from the water distribution lines and is essential to maintain water quality and verify hydrant operations.
