Thank you to those who joined us at Montgomery Fest this year. We saw record-breaking numbers, with more than 15,000 people visiting to enjoy the music, carnival, food, car show, crafts, petting zoo, and parade. I received many calls and messages from residents commending the Village for a fantastic fest. This monumental event would not be possible without the help of our outstanding staff and volunteers.

On September 9, an official ribbon cutting occurred at the new Public Works Facility. Immediately following, we welcomed the public to tour the facility in an open house event. The new building represents a monumental change and stride toward more efficient Public Works operations in Montgomery. Our old building, built in the late 50s, served our community when we had less than 2,000 residents. Today, we stand at 20,000+ and growing. The new facility allows indoor truck storage, locker rooms, office space, and other essential building features to support our team.

The Montgomery River Run will celebrate its 20th anniversary on October 7. The event offers a 5K and 10K option for runners to enjoy a scenic race along the Fox River, north to the Ashland bridge, and south to the Oswego border near Violet Patch Park. NEWS BRIEFS

Curbside leaf collection (no yard bags required) will begin on October 23 and continue for approximately five weeks.

Village offices will close on Friday, November 10, in observance of Veterans Day. Offices will reopen the following Monday during regular business hours. The holiday will not affect trash collection.

Village offices will close on Thursday, November 23, and Friday, November 24 in observance of the Thanksgiving holiday. Offices will reopen the following Monday.

There will be no garbage or recycling collection on Thanksgiving Day. Residents with scheduled pickup on Thursday will move to Friday. Friday's scheduled pickup will move to Saturday. As we prepare for the snow season, a reminder to residents that street parking during and after snowfall accumulations of two inches or more is prohibited. We ask for the community's help in removing parked cars from the Village streets during the winter months to expedite plowing operations.

The Village Board will host the Annual Tree Lighting on Sunday, December 3, at 4:00P. The event starts with a visit from Santa and the lighting of the Village Hall tree. Businesses will sponsor hot chocolate, cookies, activities, and performances. Then, view the Festival of Trees display, see the holiday lights, and celebrate winter's magic.



2023 Halloween Display & Holiday Decorations Contests

Property Tax 2022 Rebate Program

The Village's Property Tax Rebate program is back for the 9th year. Last year, the Village Board increased the refund of property taxes paid to the Village to \$75 per qualifying residential property owner. The application will be available on the Village's website (montgomeryil.org), and residents can elect a credit on their water bill or a paper check. The online application process opens on or about October 20 and closes on December 31. Paper applications are available upon request only. When filling out the form, the application requires a copy of your 2022 county property tax bill (Kane or Kendall). Staff is available at Village Hall to assist residents with completing the online application. Qualifications for the program include: property taxes paid to the Village of Montgomery, property tax and utility accounts are current, applicant-owned property for all of the calendar year 2022, and the applicant is the property owner (renters do not qualify).

Last year, the Village Board authorized a \$75 rebate as a check or water bill credit to 1,639 residents, which returned \$122,925 in 2021 tax dollars to qualifying Montgomery residential property owners we serve.

LEAF COLLECTION BEGINS OCT. 23



Crews will make one pass through the Village on October 23, 30, November 6, 13, and 20. Additional pickups will continue as needed through the end of November. Crews cannot vacuum the leaves within 10' of a tree, mailbox, fire hydrant, street light, or sign. Do not park cars in front of leaves to be collected, as the leaf vac cannot reach them.
