Mayor's Message - Matt Brolley

We are halfway through the summer which means our Village operations are in full swing. Staff and elected officials are gearing up for the beloved Montgomery Fest, which is set for August 16, 17, 18 in the newly renovated Montgomery Park (301 N. River St.). Once again, we will have three days of family-fun, carnival rides, entertainment, parade, car show, fireworks, carp derby, and more.

Pardon our dust, as our water main and capital improvement projects for FY25 are well on their way to meet deadline goals before the first frost. Our primary investment in the next several years will be the change in water source. It is imperative that we push forward to switch to Lake Michigan water as the region's deep sandstone aquifers continue to deplete. To make this transition requires lots of planning, manpower, and money. The Village must replace all its aging water infrastructure, mitigate water loss, and prepare for building new infrastructure required to source water from the DuPage Water Commission by 2032. The Village is currently undergoing a rate and fee study to address funding needs and long-term sustainability. Elected officials are working hard in reviewing funding options to ensure fiscal sustainability and responsibility. We must not only plan for today, but for the community our younger residents will inherit years from now.

I urge residents to get out and explore Montgomery with the remaining summer days. Walk along the Fox River, visit the monuments at Montgomery Park, stop by one of the National Night Out locations on August 6, or visit the team at Montgomery Fest. NEWS BRIEFS

Yard and organic waste sticker sales will begin on July 15 at Village locations (Village Hall and the Police Department) during regular business hours. Stickers are \$2.50. One sticker is required for each yard waste bag or container. Weight not to exceed 50lbs.

In observance of Independence Day, Village Admin. Offices will close on Thursday, July 4. As a result, trash collection is delayed by one day after Thursday. If your regular pickup is Thursday, it will move to Friday, and so on. Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday's collection will remain as scheduled.

Residents may only perform landscape watering and fill swimming pools between 6-9A or 6-9P. Even-numbered addresses may water on even calendar dates, and odd-numbered addresses may water on odd calendar dates. Restrictions do not apply to handheld watering devices, small pools (less than 50 gallons), or washing cars.

Please care for planted parkway trees by refilling the watering bags or soaking them with a hose for 15 minutes one or two times per week.

Join seniors (55+) for lunch at Village Hall on the 2nd Tuesday, September through December. The cost is \$8 per resident; tickets can be purchased in advance at Village Hall during regular business hours. For questions, email rboeing@montgomeryil.org or call Rosie at 331-212-9008.

Timken Aurora Bearing is "Montgomery Made"

Founded in 1971, Aurora Bearing moved to Montgomery in 1997. Acquired by Timken in 2020, the global company celebrates its 125th anniversary in 2024.

Timken Aurora Bearing is one of several manufacturing facilities that create high-quality bearings for customers worldwide, specifically the rod end, spherical plain, and journal bearings. Three years ago, this facility helped design a spherical plain bearing used on an "arm" that gathered samples on Mars from the Perseverance Rover for a study.

The Montgomery facility is home to 225 employees who fulfill the mechanical needs of various markets, such as textile and packaging, recreation and exercise equipment, agricultural, off-highway vehicles, commercial transportation, high-performance racing, military, and commercial air and aerospace.
