On Thursday, September 18, the Village will host its second Concert in the Park at Montgomery Park from 6:30-8:30. Residents are encouraged to bring chairs, blankets, picnic dinners (or grab food from one of the onsite food trucks), and enjoy the music of Symple, a bilingual rock band. The Park opens at 5P.

On Saturday, September 27, from 9A-12P, the Village will co-host a free Community Shredding opportunity with Earthmover Credit Union and State Representative Matt Hanson at the Montgomery Police Department located at 10 Civic Center Ave.

As the summer season comes to a close, garden and leaf cleanup will begin. The Village offers two complimentary programs for Village residents (excludes unincorporated areas).

- The Bulk Brush Pickup is the first full week of October each year. Bulk brush must be neat and stacked untied in the parkway on the Sunday evening before the scheduled pickup week. Crews will begin Monday morning and will make one pass through each neighborhood. The brush placed after the crews pass through will miss the collection opportunity.
- Curbside Leaf Collection (no yard waste bags), which will begin the week of Monday, October 20 (weather permitting) and continue for five weeks. Residents can rake leaves curbside, and Public Works will collect them at no charge with the Village-owned leaf vac truck.

2025 Halloween Display & Holiday Decorations Contests

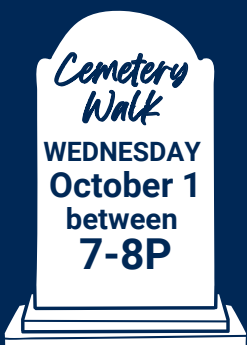

Historic Preservation Commission's 2025 Cemetery Walk



Each year, the Montgomery Historic Preservation Commission (HPC) hosts a Cemetery Walk at Riverside Cemetery the first Wednesday of October at 7P. This year's event is on Wednesday, October 1, with a rain date of Thursday, October 2. Guests are led through the cemetery in small groups to meet some of the fascinating "ghosts" of early pioneers and other cemetery residents.

This event, geared towards all ages, is not a traditional scary cemetery walk but a fun glimpse into the past with authentic characters portraying historical figures from Montgomery's past. Each year, the HPC volunteers work to highlight new stories and icons of our community who have unique stories to tell. Visitors are welcome to come any time between 7-8P. Tours begin at the corner of Taylor & River Streets on the southeast side of the cemetery approximately every 10 minutes. Parking is available along River St. near Montgomery Park.
